3.7	In support of their application Apex have advised that they have maintained regular communication and productive community engagement with both local councillors and the community group, Upper Springfield Development Trust. St Teresa's Primary School is located next to the southern boundary of the site and Apex worked with the school Principal and, with the assistance of a local historian, they organised a competition involving Primary 6 pupils for the street naming of the site.		
3.8	The developer has also applied to erect dual language street nameplates in Irish. Some further advice from counsel has been sought in relation to how these types of applications are processed. However, the developer has advised that they require the applications for the English street names to be brought forward this month for addressing and wayfinding purposes. The dual language aspect of these applications will be brought to the February Committee meeting for consideration.
