3.0	Main Report
	Key Issues
3.1	Mr. Joseph Kerr holds two Stationary Street Trading Licences, which allow him to trade from Monday to Sunday. The Licences are as follows:
	1. Fountain Lane (45ft from its junction with Donegall Place)
3.2	For the sale of confectionery, toys, clothing accessories, Halloween accessories, gift wrap, souvenirs and tour tickets including bus tours. The licence permits trading from Monday to Sunday from 0800hrs to 2200hrs.
	2. Fountain Street (20ft from its junction with Wellington Place)
3.3	For the sale confectionery, jewellery, bus tour tickets, Halloween costumes and accessories, toys, socks, non-alcoholic beverages, wrapping paper, cards, souvenirs, t-shirts, magnets, tea towels, key rings, mugs, lighters and clothing accessories. The licence permits trading from Monday to Saturday from 0830hrs to 2130hrs and on Sunday from 0830hrs to 1830hrs.
3.4	The annual fee for each Licence is £1,250.
3.5	Mr. Kerr has a long history of non-payment of licence fees. Members are reminded that the Licensing Committee previously considered his Licences, for these sites at Fountain Lane and Fountain Street, for the non-payment of the licence fee at its meeting on 19 th March 2014.
3.6	At that meeting, the Committee agreed that it was minded to revoke the Stationary Street Licences held by Mr. Kerr in respect of the designated sites and agreed also to invite him to make representation to the Committee regarding its decision.
3.7	The Licensing Committee, at its meeting on 18th June 2014, subsequently reconsidered the applications and, after being informed that Mr. Kerr had paid the outstanding licence fees, agreed to rescind its March decision and not revoke the Street Trading Licences held by Mr. Kerr for Fountain Lane and Fountain Street.
3.8	Between June 2014 and December 2015, Mr. Kerr once again proceeded to build up licence fee arrears. These arrears were eventually paid in December, 2015 when he applied for his current Licences.
3.9	Subsequently, the Licensing Committee on 16th March 2016 again considered the applications for Mr. Kerr's two Stationary Street Trading Licences due to non-payment of fees, and after hearing from him agreed to the grant the Licences.
3.10	Mr. Kerr is once again not paying his licence fees and currently owes the Council £1577.54, despite efforts to contact him.
3.11	Members may wish to note Mr. Kerr only trades sporadically and seldom uses both sites. He trades without any other licence infringements.

- 3.13 The Street Trading Act (N.I.) 2001 provides that, at any time after a Street Trading Licence has been granted, the Council may, in certain circumstances, revoke a Licence.
- The Act permits that a Council may revoke a Licence if it is satisfied that the licence holder has, without reasonable explanation, failed to pay any fees or charges due to the Council and if the licence holder has, without reasonable excuse, failed to avail himself to a reasonable extent of his licence.
- 3.15 Should the Committee be of a mind to use its discretionary power to revoke the Street Trading Licences, the Act requires that advance notice be given to the Licensee and that they be invited to make representations before a decision is made.

Financial and Resource Implications

3.16 If these Licences are revoked, there will be a loss in annual Licence Fees of £2,500. However, it is anticipated that there will be sufficient interest in these sites that the vacancies will be filled within a short time.
