# 2.0 Recommendations 2.1 Taking into account the information presented and representations received in respect of the application you are required to make a decision to either: 1. Approve the application for the variation of the 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence, or 2. Approve the application for the variation of the 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence with special conditions, or 3. Refuse the application for the variation of the 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence. 2.2 If the application is refused, or Special Conditions are attached to the licence to which the applicant does not consent, then the applicant may appeal the Council's decision within 21 days of notification of that decision to the County Court. 2.3 Should the Committee decide to refuse the variation application, and the applicant decides to Appeal, the licence will continue with its present conditions until the Appeal is determined. 3.0 Main report Key Issues Nature of the variation application 3.1 The days and hours during which the premises are currently Licensed to provide entertainment are: Monday to Sunday: 11.00 am to 1.00 am the following morning, 3.2 The nature of the variation is to extend the hours during which entertainment may be provided from 1.00 am to 2.00 am on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. 3.3 In addition, the applicant has specified 6 occasions during the year for which approval is sought to provide entertainment to 2.00 am should the occurrences fall on either a Sunday, Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday night. The occasions specified by the applicant include Boxing Night, New Year's Eve, St. Patrick's night, Easter Monday, May Day and Halloween. 3.4 The applicant has provided a rationale to support their application for the extension in hours, this being: -• Their students (local and international) have an expectation that entertainment is available until 2.00am. Not being able to trade to 2.00am will put them at a disadvantage. QUBSU had a 3.00am Licence for many years and understand the associated responsibility. 3.5 A copy of the applicant's submission is included on the application form in Appendix 1. 3.6 Details of the request to amend the initial application to that as outlined in 3.2 and 3.3 is attached in Appendix 2.

- 3.7 Members are reminded that the normal process for dealing with Entertainments Licence applications which are not the subject of objections is that the licence will be granted as provided for in the Council's Scheme of Delegation.
- However, because the applicant has applied for a variation to extend the hours of entertainment past 1.00 am, the application is being presented to you for consideration.
- 3.9 The areas currently Licensed to provide indoor entertainment are the:
  - Ground Floor, with a maximum capacity of 410 persons.
  - First Floor, with a maximum capacity of 220 persons.
  - Second Floor, with a maximum capacity of 10 persons.
- 3.10 The premise operates as a Public House with entertainment currently provided in the form of DJ's and live band performances.
- **3.11** A location map is attached as Appendix 3.

#### Representations

3.12 Notice of the application has been advertised and no written representations have been lodged.

## **PSNI**

3.13 The PSNI have confirmed that they have no objection to the application. A copy of their correspondence is attached as Appendix 4.

#### **Health, Safety and Welfare Issues**

Two During Performance Inspection have been undertaken by Officers from the Service since the licence was granted on 1st September 2018 and all technical requirements and associated operational and management procedures have been checked and are satisfactory.

#### **NIFRS**

3.15 The Northern Ireland Fire Rescue Service have confirmed that they have no objection to the application. A copy of their correspondence is attached as Appendix 4.

#### **Noise Issues**

3.16 Four noise complaints have been received by the Service since the premises has been operating. Details of complaints have been conveyed to representatives of the premises on each occasion when the Service has been notified of a disturbance. A detailed response has been provided to the Service on behalf of the applicant following investigations into the noise complaints received. The response has been provided in Appendix 5.



If Committee decides not to revoke the Licence, Members are asked to consider making it a requirement upon renewal that Mr Kerr must pay his renewal application fee of £150 and the Licence fee of £1,250 in full for the year before the licence is granted. A total of £1,400, instead of the current Council policy of offering any applicant the opportunity to pay their fee over the term of the licence, and that any subsequent licence must be renewed annually. That is in addition to paying off the debt on this Licence.

2.3

If the licence is revoked, the licensee may appeal the Council's decision within 21 days of notification of that decision to the Magistrates' Court. If an appeal is lodged the Licensee may continue to operate under the terms of the existing licence until such times as the Court make a determination in relation to the appeal.

The Council will take action to recover any outstanding debt.

### 3.0 Main report

#### Key Issues

Committee is reminded that, at your meeting on 16 May 2018, you agreed that you were minded to revoke two Street Trading Licences held by Mr Joseph Kerr and that he be invited to make representation to the Committee regarding that decision.

### **Fountain Street**

- 3.2 At your meeting on 17 October 2018, you affirmed the decision of 16 May 2018 to revoke the Licence for Fountain Street (20ft from its junction with Wellington Place).
- 3.3 Committee decided to revoke the Licence for Fountain Street as it was the less utilised of Mr Kerr's two sites.
- Mr Kerr was advised that, at any time within twenty-one days from the date on which notice of the decision was given by the Council, he could appeal the decision through the Magistrates' Court. Mr Kerr has lodged an appeal with the Magistrate's Court Office in relation to Fountain Street, the provisional date for the hearing is 8<sup>th</sup> January 2019, the Council is still waiting on papers regarding the basis of the appeal.

#### **Fountain Lane**

- 3.5 The remaining Licence is for Fountain Lane; 45ft from its junction with Donegall Place.
- This Licence expires on 20 March 2019 and is for the sale of confectionery, toys, clothing accessories, Halloween accessories, gift-wrap, souvenirs and tour tickets including bus tours. The licence permits trading from Monday to Sunday from 08.00hrs to 22.00hrs.
- Committee is reminded that, at your meeting of 20 November, you agreed to defer consideration of the site in Fountain Lane to allow Officers to obtain further information with regard to Mr Kerr's proposed repayment plan. This was after the Licensee had sent the Council an email stating that he would pay £250 off the arrears on 28th of each month.
- Members had asked for clarity if the £250 was to service the debt or his Licence fee and debt. Mr Kerr has confirmed, via his wife, verbally, that the £250 is to service the debt and that he will start making Licence fee payments as well.
- At the time of writing this report, one payment for £354.16 has been received reducing the debt by £250 and paying the monthly licence fee for this site. The current debt is now £2,641.04. No formal payment plan has been agreed with the Council.

3.10	Legislative background The Street Trading Act (N.I.) 2001 provides that, at any time after a Street Trading Licence has been granted, the Council may, in certain circumstances, revoke a Licence.
3.11	The Act permits that a Council may revoke a Licence if it is satisfied that the licence holder has, without reasonable explanation, failed to pay any fees or charges due to the Council and if the licence holder has, without reasonable excuse, failed to avail himself to a reasonable extent of his licence.
3.12	Attached as Appendix 1 is a copy of the minute from your meeting of 16 May 2018.

#### **Licences issued under Delegated Authority**

The Committee noted a list of licences which had been issued under the Council's Scheme of Delegation.

## <u>Review of Stationary Street Trading Licences –</u> Fountain Lane and Fountain Street

The Building Control Manager informed the Committee that Mr. Joseph Kerr had, for several years, held a Stationary Street Trading Licence for each of the above-mentioned sites.

He reported that, during that time, he had failed consistently to pay his annual licence fee and reminded the Committee that it had, in the past, agreed that it was

minded to revoke both licences. The Committee had subsequently agreed only to rescind its decision upon being advised that the outstanding fees had been paid in full. He drew the Members' attention to the fact that Mr. Kerr had again failed to pay his licence fees and that, despite efforts by officers to contact him, he owed currently £1,577.54 in total. In addition, inspections had revealed that he was trading only sporadically and that he seldom utilised both sites.

The Building Control Manager pointed out that the Street Trading Act (Northern Ireland) 2001 stipulated that the Council could, in certain circumstances, revoke a licence at any time after it had been granted. Such circumstances would include, as in this case, the non-payment, without reasonable explanation, of fees and charges and a failure to avail to a reasonable extent of a licence. He explained that, should the Committee be minded to revoke Mr. Kerr's Licence, the aforementioned Act required that he be provided with advance notification to that effect and be invited to either make written representation to the Committee or to attend a future meeting in person.

After discussion, the Committee agreed that it was minded to revoke the Stationary Street Trading Licences held by Mr. Joseph Kerr in respect of the designated sites at Fountain Lane and Fountain Street and agreed that he be invited to make representation to the Committee regarding that decision.

The Committee agreed also that a report be submitted to a future meeting providing information on those street traders who had failed to pay their licence fees and on those who were not utilising their licences on a regular basis.

Approve the application for the provisional grant of 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence, or 2. Approve the application for the provisional grant of 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence with Special Conditions, or 3. Refuse the application for the provisional grant of 7-Day Annual Indoor Entertainments Licence. 2.2 If the application is refused, or Special Conditions are attached to the licence to which the applicant does not consent, then the applicant may appeal the Council's decision within 21 days of notification of that decision to the County Court. 2.3 If you are of a mind to refuse the application or attach Special Conditions to the licence within 7 days from the date of the Council's decision the applicant will be advised in writing of their right to an opportunity of appearing before and of being heard by the Committee. 3.0 Main report **Key Issues** Provisional grant of a licence 3.1 There is provision within the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (NI) Order (the Order) to make application for the grant of an entertainments licence in respect of premises which are to be, or are in the course of being, constructed, extended or altered. 3.2 If the Council is satisfied that the premises would, if completed in accordance with plans deposited in accordance with the requirements of the Council, be such that it would grant the licence, the Council may grant the licence subject to a Condition that it shall be of no effect until confirmed by the Council. 3.3 This is described as the provisional grant of a licence. 3.4 The Order stipulates that the Council must confirm any licence granted provisionally when it is satisfied that the premises have been completed in accordance with the plans deposited with the application or in accordance with those plans as modified with the approval of the council. 3.5 Should Members be of mind to grant the licence provisionally, Committee is requested to consider delegating authority to the Director of Planning and Building Control in consultation with the City Solicitor to issue the licence once all necessary technical requirements relating to health, safety, welfare and amenity have been completed to the satisfaction of the Building Control Service.

#### Extended hours of entertainment

- 3.6 Members are reminded that the normal process for dealing with an Entertainments Licence application which is not the subject of objections is that the licence will be granted as provided for in the Council's Scheme of Delegation.
- 3.7 The applicant has applied to provide entertainment beyond the latest hour to which licences are normally granted. As such, the application is being presented before Committee for your consideration.
- 3.8 The applicant has applied to provide entertainment on the following days and hours:
  - Monday to Sunday: 12.00 pm to 3.00 am the following morning.
- 3.9 The applicant has provided a rationale to support their application for the extended hours of entertainment which, in summary, includes:-
  - The desire to provide entertainment in line with the operation of other city centre licensed premises, which offer similar entertainment.
  - There is an expectation amongst young people that certain events should end at 3.00am and that a 1.00am finish is not value for money. This is particularly true for customers travelling from other countries with more relaxed licensing laws.
  - The additional hours will help them attract more international acts to the City.
- 3.10 A copy of the applicant's rationale for a 3.00 am Entertainment Licence is appended to this report as Appendix 3.

## Venue details

- 3.11 The area where indoor entertainment is proposed to be provided is the:
  - Ground floor area with a maximum capacity of 1500 persons.
- The ground floor is a flexible space that will be used to provide a variety of events. Whilst the maximum numbers for the area will be approximately 1500 persons an occupancy will be agreed for each event by the Service after an assessment of individual event details and layout.
- The applicant proposes to provide entertainment in the form of live bands, DJ's and theatre. During these occasions, they will operate a public bar facility via an Occasional Liquor Licence.
- 3.14 The applicant has provided additional information advising of the types of events they propose to hold in the premises, which include: -
  - Live music performances
  - Comedy
  - Filming
  - Award ceremonies
  - Podcasts
  - Fashion Shows
  - Film Festivals

#### Conferences

- 3.15 Members are advised that not all these events will fall within the scope of entertainments licensing.
- 3.16 A copy of the applicant's submission is included on the application form attached in Appendix 4.
- 3.17 Layout plans of the venue are attached as Appendix 5.

#### Representations

- 3.18 Notice of the application has been advertised and one written representation in support of the application has been lodged which is attached as Appendix 6.
- At the time of writing this report no written representations have been received objecting to the application. However, as the 28-day statutory objection period does not expire until 11<sup>th</sup> December 2018 Members will be advised at your meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> December if any objections have been received.

#### **PSNI**

The PSNI has been consulted and has confirmed that they have no objection to the application. A copy of their correspondence is attached as Appendix 7.

#### Health, safety and welfare inspections

- This building was previously used by Arnott's for fruit and vegetable storage. The applicant has submitted a Building Regulations application for the change of use to an assembly building. It is envisaged that the building works to refurbish this space will commence in January 2019.
- Before the Entertainments Licence can be confirmed as outlined in 3.4 the Building Regulations application must be approved, and all site works must be completed to the satisfaction of the Service in accordance with the Regulations. This will ensure compliance, amongst other matters, with all fire safety, structural and access requirements.
- 3.23 All certification pre-requisite to the grant of a licence will also be required before the licence can be confirmed.

#### **NIFRS**

The Northern Ireland Fire and Rescue Service has been consulted in relation to the application and we are awaiting their response. Officers will advise of the NIFRS response at the Committee meeting on 12th December 2018.

## Noise Issues

3.25 Given the nature of the entertainment in the venue, an acoustic report outlining the measures to be taken to ensure minimal disturbance to persons in the neighbourhood, either due to noise breakout or from patron activity, has been requested from the applicant. The acoustic report has been submitted to the Environmental Protection Unit and consultations are ongoing to ensure all relevant steps are taken to address any noise issues.

3.26	If Members are of the mind to grant the provisional application for the Entertainments Licence delegated authority is sought, before confirming the licence, to attach any Terms and Conditions to the Licence regarding the management of noise. Such conditions will only be attached with the full agreement of the licensee.


