The Lord Mayor will indicate at the Council meeting those Notices of Motion that have been considered by the Standards and Business Committee and whether such Notices of Motion were rejected or adopted. In either case, the proposer only may speak on the issue at Council.</i></li> <li data-bbox="363 667 1514 835">(n) <i>The Standards and Business Committee will refer all Notices of Motion directly to a standing committee when the matter to which the Notice of Motion refers falls within the remit of that committee. At Council, the Lord Mayor will indicate that the Notice of Motion was received and referred. 3.2	<p data-bbox="316 1473 683 1507"><b><u>Rosetta Way – “quietway”</u></b></p> <p data-bbox="316 1574 595 1608">“Belfast City Council:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li data-bbox="363 1641 1514 1742">• Recognises that many neighbourhoods across the city suffer from the blight of congestion, poor air quality, commuter traffic, under investment in active travel measures and road safety issues;</li> <li data-bbox="363 1776 1514 1877">• Recalls that the Council has already expressed its support for measures like School Streets and Low Traffic Neighbourhoods as well as the creation of a “quietway” linking Lagan Gateway to Cregagh Glen, through Cherryvale Playing Fields;</li> <li data-bbox="363 1910 1514 1989">• Believes that a “quietway” through Rosetta - a “Rosetta Way” along with associated measures like active travel infrastructure, reduced speed limits, the closing up of rat</li> </ul>
