3.1	At the meeting of the Standards and Business Committee held on 28th March, the fo		
	motion, which was proposed by Councillor McKeown and seconded by Councillor Whyte,		
	was referred to the Committee for consideration:		
3.2	"This Council recognises the impact graffiti has on communities in terms of the		
	environment and appearance of an area, but also on the wellbeing of residents.		
	While the Council has a limited programme of graffiti removal and the role of this is		
	under regular review, it is recognised that this alone cannot meet the widespread need		
	to tackle this issue, nor should it fall solely to the ratepayer to fund this work.		
	The Council will therefore commence work on developing Memorandums of		
	Understanding with utility companies, telecoms companies, government departments		
	and other public bodies to seek agreement that they will remove graffiti on utility boxes		
	and other property within their ownership within a defined, short period of time. Further,		
	the Council will look at whether any additional bye-laws are required to support this		
	work.

	To enable the simple and quick reporting and redirection of graffiti notifications to		
	responsible bodies under this model, the Council will work with these groups to map		
	and catalogue public infrastructure and its respective ownership, and provide a single		
	point of contact within the Customer Hub for members of the public and council staff		
	to report incidents, which will then be redirected to the responsible body for action		
	under the Memorandums of Understanding."
