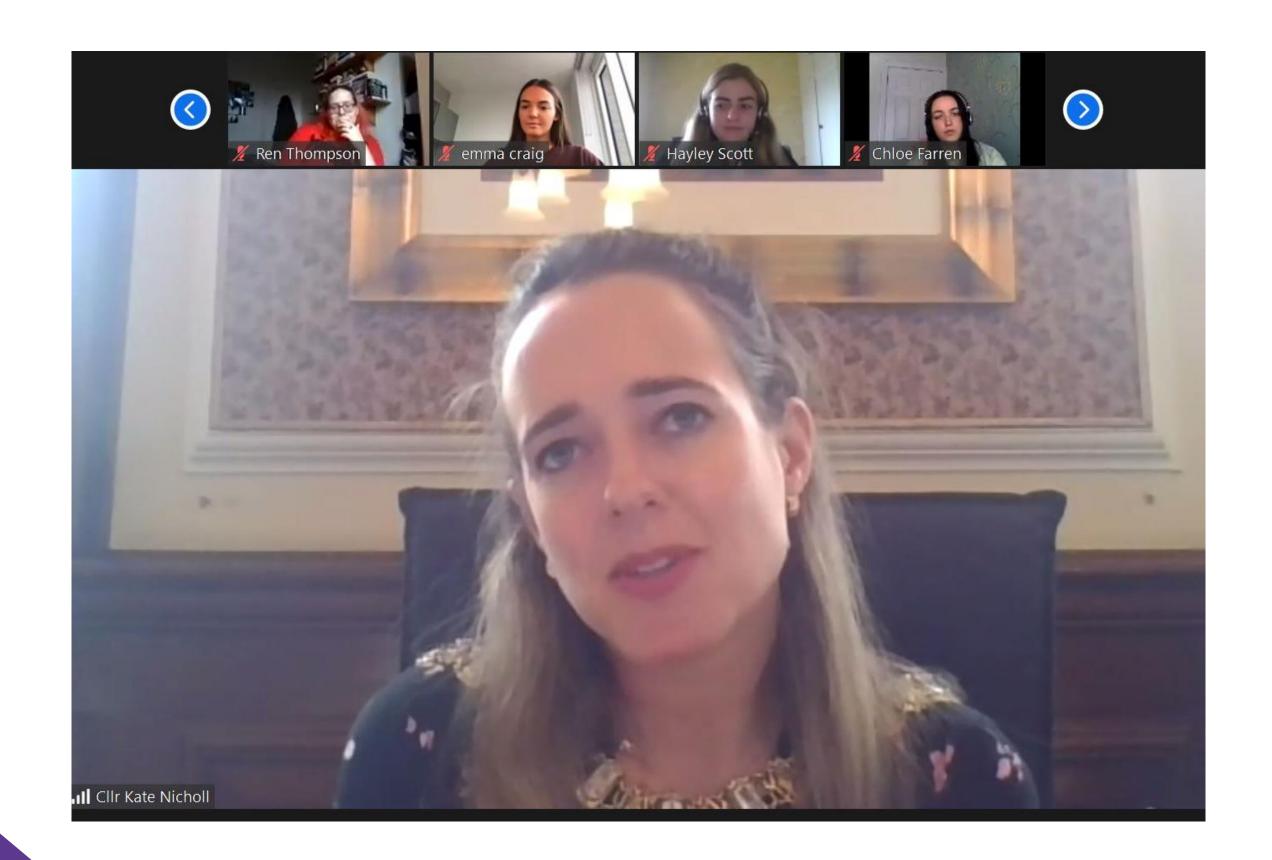
What is Legacy?

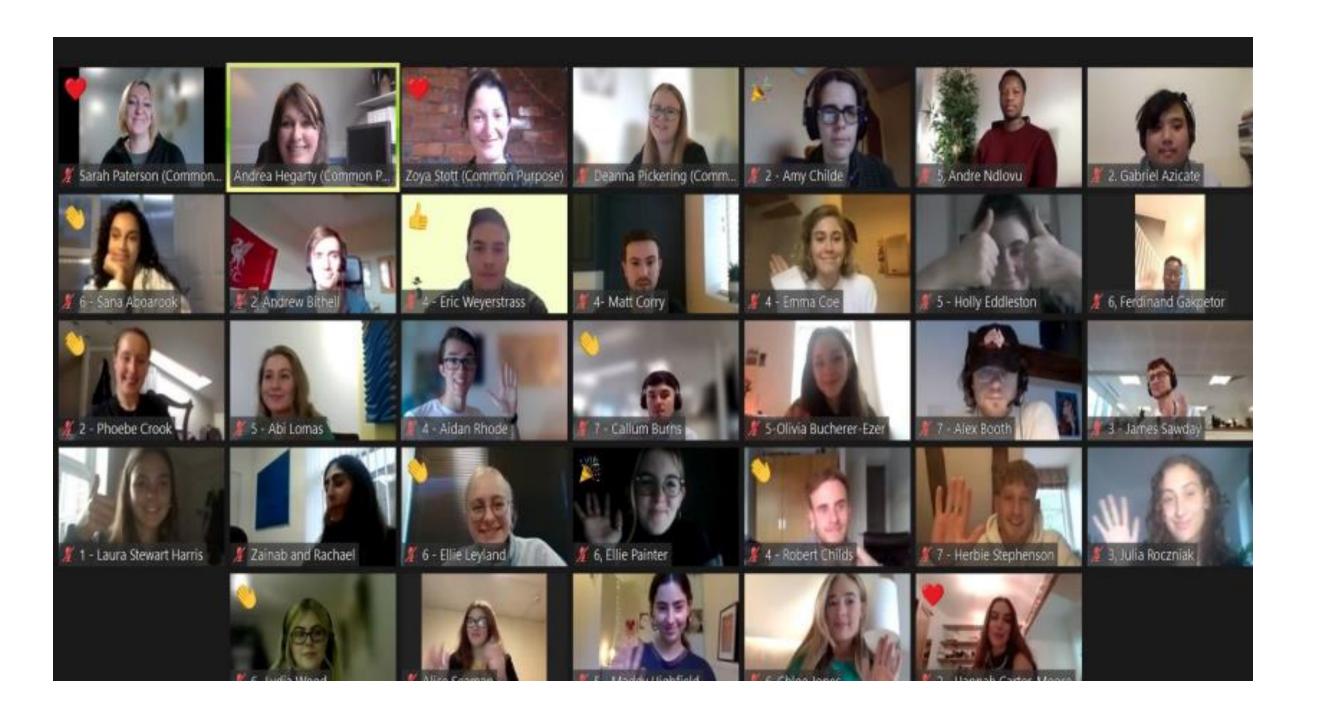

Legacy in the UK



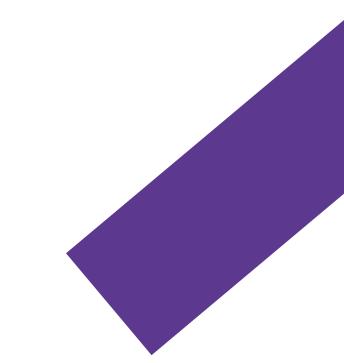
In the three years since March 2020, we have run at least one Legacy programme in twelve locations in the UK: Birmingham, Bradford, Cumbria, Glasgow, Greater Manchester, Lancashire, Leeds, London, Newcastle, Northern Ireland, Sheffield and Sunderland, involving:

987 young leaders545 established leaders

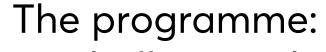

A survey of our Legacy alumni* showed that after their programme:

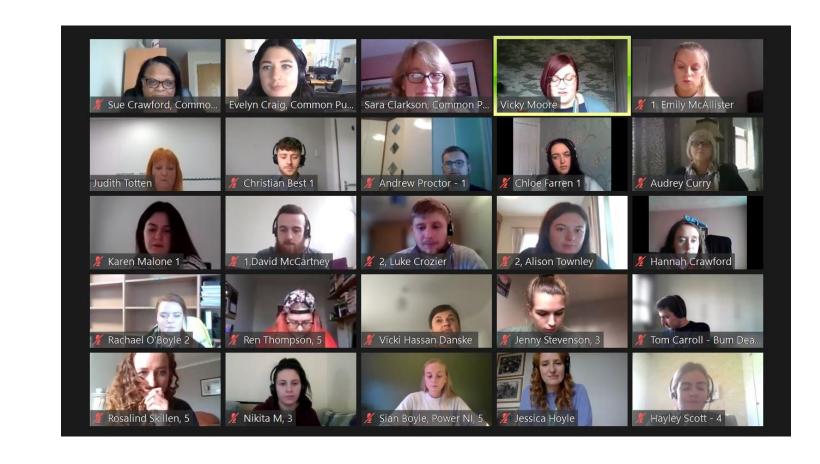
- 86% felt a responsibility to shape the future of their locality

- 89% feel better prepared to work with people who are different from them
- 88% would recommend a Legacy programme to others
- 86% said the programme was good value-for-time

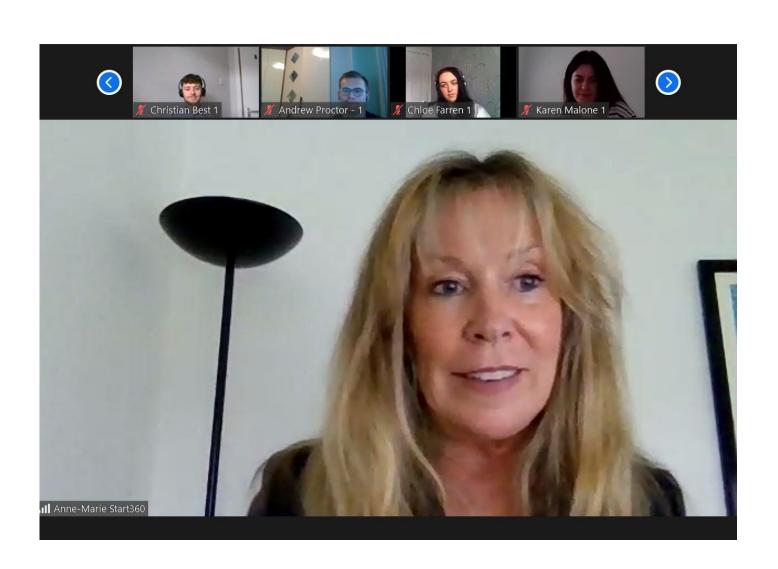
