3.1	The Standards and Business Committee, at its meeting on 28th November, considered the	
	following motion which had been received for submission to the Council on 4th December:	
	Right to Grow on Council-Owned Land	
	"This Council notes the pressures upon food security caused by many issues,	
	including the cost-of-living crisis, the impact of the pandemic and climate change. It is, therefore, vital that the Council plays its part to ensure that our citizens have	
	access to enough fresh food for day-to-day living.	
	The Council, therefore, agrees to adopt a right to grow on Council-owned land	
	which is suitable for cultivation. This would probably involve licensing cultivation of	
	suitable land via community groups."
