	Background
3.1	Thursday 6 th June will see the 80 th Anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy in 1944. Multi-
	National allied forces including US, UK, Polish, Canadian, French and Dutch forces carried out
	the beach landings which initiated the retaking of mainland European from occupying Axis forces.
3.2	Belfast and Northen Ireland as a whole played a significant role in the training and preparation
	for D-Day, hosting a considerable number of US Servicemen before their deployment as well as
	facilitating the necessary training required for the operation. The anniversary will be marked
	across Northern Ireland as well as international commemorations focussed on Normandy itself.
