1.1	The purpose of this report is to provide Members with an update on the recent workshop of
	the People and Communities committee and the Belfast City Youth Council on 21st May
	2024.

2.1	Members are asked to note the contents of the report.
3.0	Main Report
3.1	Members of the new cohort of the Belfast City Youth Council attended a workshop with
	members of the People and Communities committee on 21st May 2024.
3.2	The workshop began with a presentation from Montserrat Fargas, QUB, who provided an
	overview of the Radical Programme. RADICAL (Respect and Disrespect in Children's and
	Adolescents Lives) is a two year study that aims to develop theories of dis/respect that can
	better inform policies and interventions that impact the lives of children and young people.
	The BCYC are acting as an advisory group for the Belfast area, the programme will involve
	engagement with over 7000 young people across the region.
3.3	The Children & Young People (C&YP) Co-ordinator gave an overview of the operation of the
	BCYC to date following the welcome event for the new cohort on January 10 th , 2024. The
	young people meet every fortnight and have met ten times to date. A residential will take
	place in the summer and during the residential the young people will elect office bearers for
	BCYC including the roles of Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary.
3.4	There will be an article within the summer addition of City Matters highlighting work to date;
	the RADICAL programme and future work of BCYC. The C&YP Co-ordinator has been
	working with the corporate communications team to develop a social media presence for
	BCYC and a communications plan, which will be a key area of work.
3.5	Members of the youth council then took the opportunity to share the detail of some of their
0.0	priorities for 24/25. A number of key areas of interest have emerged, which include;
	Environment, Education, Poverty, Health and Wellbeing and Sectarianism and Inclusion.
3.6	Elected members congratulated the BCYC members in attendance on the areas of work that
	they had identified as priorities and committed to providing whatever support they could to
	BCYC in their efforts to develop projects and campaigns to address these issues.
