	A report proposing enhanced summer scheme provision was brought to the February 2024 meeting of the People and Communities Committee and an amount of £80,000 was approved through Strategic Policy and Resources committee to support provision across each of the four areas of the city with decisions to be approved through the Area Based Working Groups The table below indicates the funding offered to each organisation.

- Officers have continued to work alongside the delivery organisations, with eight of the nine organisations completing delivery, reporting on finance and performance, and receiving their funding in accordance with letters of offer. Reporting and final payment has not yet been completed by Ledley Hall Trust.
- Delivery organisations applied a range of delivery methods based on their internal resources and specific needs of their target group. Data compiled to date, which does not include a return from Ledley Hall, confirms that the pilot scheme afforded a welcome opportunity for the organisations to provide high quality provision for 294 unique individuals with a total of 2,335 participations recorded across all sessions.

Allocation Model for 2025

The purpose of the funding is to enhance provision within the sector and will be available to support participation for those who cannot access any other summer scheme, programmes or services during the summer months due to support needs.

3.6	It is recommended that a total amount of £20,000 is allocated per area, north, south, east an west Belfast. Applicants will be required to submit a proposal demonstrating all of the followin opportunities, along with a proposed budget;
