EVIDENCE, ADVOCACY AND STRATEGY £25k

Commission audit of current C&YO work in BCC and in Belfast

Work already commissioned and near completion

Create BCC Strategy - £5k

Process to take place over next six months with draft to Committee by December 09

Facilitate development of Belfast Strategy including major conference - £20k

Twin process of engagement with key stakeholders with the city culminating in a major conference by March 2010

ACTIVITY AND PARTICIPATION £75k

Create 'Take back the City' programme, July-Oct 09

The object is to increase children and young peoples' awareness of what is available and to encourage and enhance their participation in the City – hence the title

Launch- July 09

Programme City Centre - £25k

The city centre programme will build on the current Urban Trans Programme, which takes place in July/Aug. It will expand the programme to include a number of events and participative projects including an Ulster Hall event

Programme Neighbourhoods - £40k

The Neighbourhood Programme will complement the existing whole city play scheme but will run from July to Sept 09. The programme will involve a linked City Programme for children/young people with the 11 Neighbourhood Partnerships as key partner.

Review / relaunch Youth Forum - £5k

The Youth Forum will be refreshed taking into account the recent review of its practice and relaunched

Finish with key events at Reopening of City Hall - £5k

A number of key events are planned for children and young people at the reopening of City Hall including a carnival day, a family fun day, Oh Yeah concert and a youth performance (subject to Council Agreement)
