| 1   | Relevant Background Information   |
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| 1.1 | Over the past number of years there have been three businesses operating city sightseeing activity in Belfast. Early in 2014, one of these ceased its operation in the city centre.   |
| 1.2 | In recent years, a number of problems in respect of the provision of city<br>sightseeing coach tours have arisen. This has resulted in a multi agency approach<br>to try and remedy issues, particularly at times of cruise ship visits to Belfast and<br>around the summer period.   |
| 1.3 | 65 offences were investigated in 2012/13.   |
| 1.4 | At a recent meeting hosted by DVA, a multi-agency group came together to discuss trying to find a resolution to ongoing tensions. This was attended by representatives from Driver & Vehicle Agency (DVA), Department for Regional Development (DRD), Belfast City Centre Management (BCCM), BCC, PSNI and the coach operators currently operating the service. |

| 2   | Key Issues   |
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| 2.1 | Legislation currently allows for three coach operator licences in the city centre.   |
| 2.2 | There are currently two coach tour companies operating in the city centre - City Sightseeing and Titanic Tours.  |
| 2.3 | At the multi-agency meeting on 28 February, one of the outcomes requested was for an independent piece of work to be undertaken to explore whether two or three city sightseeing coach operators was most economically viable. |

| 2.4 | It was suggested also that this report could recommend a best practice model for delivery of city sightseeing coach tour services for consideration by the DVA and other relevant agencies. |  |
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| 2.5 | It was deemed that Belfast City Council was best placed to commission this report.  |  |
