3.1	<u>Key Issues</u> The Council, at its meeting on 5th May, considered the following Notice of Motion which had been moved by Councillor Heading and seconded by Councillor Convery: <p style="text-align: center;"><i>“This Council, having taken note of the level of fuel poverty in the city, urges the Northern Ireland Executive to recognise the relationship which exists between fuel poverty and poor home insulation.</i>”</p>

The Council further notes the core study and research carried out by the Mount Eagles Drive Action Group and the South Eastern Regional College into the health and financial impacts which the poor quality of the installation of cavity wall insulation can have.

The Council calls upon the Northern Ireland Executive to provide direction to civil servants to enter into a process with the industry to identify effective measures (legislative and other) to address the problem of failure in cavity wall insulation.”
