1 Relevant Background Information

The Committee is asked to note that the Council has received a request asking for the Lord Mayor or his nominee to attend the Translink Ulster in Bloom award ceremony in mid March 2011, the date and venue yet to be confirmed:

Ulster in Bloom is Northern Ireland's longest standing community gardening competition. It is organised by NILGA and sponsored by Translink and the Northern Ireland Tourist Board.

The competition aims to improve and enhance the environment in Northern Ireland through the imaginative use of trees, shrubs, flowers and landscaping. Also considered are efforts to deal with litter, graffiti, vandalism and dog fouling together with conservation and recycling.

The areas involved are assessed by a team of judges and horticultural experts over the Summer months.

2 Key Issues

The key issues for the committee to note are:

- The event is being organised by NILGA, Northern Ireland Local Government Association and sponsored by Translink
- 2. The Council has participated in this event for over twenty years
- 3. The Council has previously donated a trophy annually to the Northern Ireland local authority which was noted by Ulster in Bloom Judges as having the best public display of Roses;
- 4. The Lord Mayor or their nominee representing Belfast City Council, is required to present the Roses trophy to the representative of the winning local authority at the award ceremony.
