### 1 Relevant Background Information

At a recent meeting arranged by a local councillor, officers received a request from members of the Shankill Historical Society for permission to erect two small memorials within the grounds of the Shankill Cemetery.

The society wishes to commemorate the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of a Luftwaffe bombing raid on 15-16 April 1941 which resulted in the loss of life within the community. A diagram of the proposed structure is attached as Appendix 1 together with suggested wording.

The second memorial relates to a commemoration to the final resting place of a Williamite soldier. The society has asked if the council would agree to the erection of a small plaque in memory of a Corporal Smith who, according to the Journal of the Very Rev Rowland Davies, LL.D, Dean of Ross, was buried in the cemetery on 16 July 1690. The plaque would be located on the boundary wall adjacent to the grave. A copy of the journal entry is attached as Appendix 2.

## 2 Key Issues

The main issue for the committee is whether it wishes to give consent to the erection of the memorials.

There is no significant maintenance attached to these commemorations. The society has been advised that the council will not undertake to replace the items if they are subsequently damaged through vandalism or anti social behaviour.

It would be intended that the council include the memorial to those who

lost their lives in the bombing in 1941 be included within the insurance schedule for public liability purposes.
