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1 Relevant Background Information

The purpose of this report is to report to committee the use of the delegated authority for decisions taken over the summer recess period.

The council's scheme of delegation is one of the key governance documents in place and aims to improve the operation of the council as a whole and ensure that the responsibility and accountability for making and implementing various levels of decision is properly allocated between Members and officers.

The current scheme of delegation is in three parts:

- i Preamble and Interpretation
- ii General Delegated Functions
- iii Specifically Delegated Functions

2 Key Issues

Since the committee's last meeting in June the following decisions were taken in the interests of efficient ongoing running of the business under Section 3 of the scheme and in conjunction with the Chairman of the Committee where appropriate:

- 1. a request for the use of Botanic for an event for the Filipino community:
- 2. a request to hold fitness/dance classes in at least five of our parks:
- agreement in principle to use one of our parks/pitches to hold a charity "Polo in the City" event subject to a number of preconditions being met;
- 4. the removal of the £5 administrative fee associated with the Boost loyalty card; and
- 5. authority to proceed with a reduced price promotional campaign to try to increase numbers attending our leisure centres

3 Resource Implications

Financial

Only one of the decisions taken has clear financial implications (no. 4) however this was a new charge implemented only a couple of months previously and both customer and staff feedback was that it was not welcomed by either group.
