## 1 Relevant Background Information

Over the last number of years officers have been working on a clear phased approach to cemetery and crematorium development in the city based on an analysis of data gathered, trend information and the development of a robust plan to meet current and future service requirements.

As part of the approach a process has been undertaken to identify a site for development as a new cemetery and a report was brought to February Committee to provide Members with information on a potential site at Dundrod

At this meeting Members agreed 'that officers proceed with discussions regarding the Dundrod site and present a report on options to a future meeting of the committee'.

### 2 Key Issues

Since the Committee meeting in February several Members took part in the site visit that was organised to the view the land that has been identified as a potential site.

Officers from the department, Legal Services and Estates have held an initial meeting with the landowner and his representative. Various issues were discussed at this meeting including the ownership boundaries and "title" of the site in question.

Following this meeting correspondence has been sent to the landowner's

solicitors for clarification of several points around ownership. On receipt of this information officers will bring a report to Committee outlining the next stages in the process.

# 3 Resource Implications

#### Financial

There is provision of £13.9 M in the Council's capital programme for new cemetery provision for Belfast City Council.

There are no human resource implications at this stage.

# Asset and Other Implications

None at this stage although the final phases of the project will inevitably increase the Council's land ownership and associated liabilities.
