1 Relevant Background Information

The European Heritage Open Days celebrates Northern Ireland Architecture by allowing free access to interesting and or unusual properties that are normally not open or would charge an entrance fee. The Heritage Open Days were established in 1994 by the Civic Trust in England and have now been introduced in Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

All the City Council properties that are to be listed are open to the public on these dates anyway. However the staff will be made aware of the EHOD in order that any preparations can be made for the expected influx of visitors on these days.

2 Key Issues

The purpose of this report is to inform members of the buildings, parks and cemeteries that will be participating in this event on the 8 and 9 September 2012. In recent years various facilities within Parks and leisure Department have participated in the European Heritage Open Day Initiative.
