### 1 Relevant Background Information

The Council has received two letters of request, one from an elected member and one from the Mary Peters Track Committee in relation to naming the Photo Finish and Public Address Booth in the new stand at Mary Peters' Track after the former sports editor of the Belfast Telegraph, Dr Malcolm Brodie MBE who died in January 2013.

Dr Brodie MBE grew up in Scotland and began his career at the Portadown News, before moving to the Belfast Telegraph in 1943 where, in 1950, he set up the newspaper's first sports department, with himself as editor. Despite retiring as sports editor of the Belfast Telegraph in 1991, he continued to write a column called 'Down Memory Lane' and remained an honorary life employee of the newspaper.

Dr Brodie MBE received many accolades in recognition of his work, among them an honorary doctorate from the University of Ulster, induction into the Belfast Sports Hall of Fame, the inaugural Doug Gardner Memorial Award in 1990 from the Sports Journalists' Association for services to the profession and an All-Ireland Journalists' Association lifetime achievement award. He received an MBE for services to journalism in 1979.

Dr Brodie MBE was also Vice President of the Mary Peters Trust.

#### 2 Key Issues

The Parks and Leisure Committee at its meeting In August 2008 agreed a policy framework for managing requests to (re)name parks and leisure facilities. The policy only applies to the (re)naming of entire parks and facilities. The policy further recommended that the policy apply only to local parks and leisure facilities.

The following criteria were agreed for assessing requests which were to memorialise a person:

- The person must have made a "significant contribution" to the life of the area / City / or made a significant positive contribution to parks and leisure objectives within the community where the facility is located.
- The person must have lived within the locality / District Electoral Area of the Park and Leisure facility.
- The person must have been deceased for a minimum of five years.
- If the nominee is deceased then appropriate relatives or friends will be contacted asking if they approve of the request. If the relatives or friends do not approve, the naming process will not be pursued.

It was also agreed by Committee that if the Council decide that the proposed name change meets the criteria, the applicant will have to undertake consultation with users and the local community to show that there is widespread support for the name change. In summary 50% of the catchment area population of the park should be consulted and the applicant will have to demonstrate that 66% of the sample i.e. 50% of the catchment area population agrees with the proposed name change.

Whilst the policy does not apply to (re)naming parts of parks or structures within them, the Committee may want to give some consideration to these criteria when considering this request.

Whilst Dr Brodie MBE does not meet all the criteria in that he has not been deceased for a minimum of 5 years and he did not live within the DEA of the facility he did make a 'significant contribution' to the life of the city through his work.

Members may decide that because this request is a request to name a structure within a playing field site rather than an entire park, that in this instance, although it does not meet all the criteria, they agree to the request and that consultation is not required.
