### LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Local Government (Boundaries) Order (Northern Ireland) 2012

Draft Order laid before the Assembly under section 50(7) of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 for approval.

Made

Coming into operation in accordance with Article 1

This Order is made in exercise of the powers conferred by section 50(10) of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972(a).

In pursuance of section 50(6) of that Act, the Local Government Boundaries Commissioner submitted a report to the Department of the Environment recommending the boundaries and the names of the 11 districts mentioned in section 1 of the Local Government (Boundaries) Act (Northern Ireland) 2008(b) and the number, boundaries and names of the wards into which each district is to be divided;

This Order gives effect to those recommendations with modifications;

Accordingly the Department of the Environment makes the following Order:

### Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) The Order may be cited as the Local Government (Boundaries) Order (Northern Ireland) 2012.
- (2) Subject to paragraphs (3) and (4), this Order shall come into operation on the day on which an election under section 11(1) and 11(1A) of the Electoral Law Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(c) is first held after the making of this Order.
- (3) For the purpose of all proceedings preliminary to or, relating to an election to be held on or after, that day, this Order shall come into operation on [insert date – day after making].
- (4) For the purpose of making and levying of rates, as provided in Part II of the Rates (Northern Ireland) Order 1977(d), this Order shall come into effect on 1st April 2015.

- 2.—(1) The names of the 11 districts into which Northern Ireland shall be divided for the purposes of local government shall be as set out in Schedule 1.
- (2) Each district shall comprise the area designated on the maps by reference to the name of the district and demarcated by a red line.
- (3) The 11 districts shall be divided into wards which shall bear the names set out in Schedule 2; and each such ward shall comprise the area designated on the maps by reference to the name of the ward and demarcated by a blue line.
- (4) Where a boundary of a district or ward is shown along a road, railway line, path, stream, river or similar topographical feature, it shall be treated as being along the centre line thereof unless otherwise stated on the maps.
- (5) The wards constituted by this Order shall have the boundaries thereof mered by the Department of Finance and Personnel.
  - (6) In this Article the expression "the maps" shall be construed in accordance with Article 3.

### Maps

3. The maps referred to in this Order are the volumes of maps, showing the local government districts of Northern Ireland and the wards into which those districts are divided, each of which volume has been marked— "MAPS REFERRED TO IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (BOUNDARIES) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 2012" and signed and sealed with reference to this Order and deposited at the office of the Department of the Environment at Goodwood House, 44-58 May Street, Belfast, BT1 4NN.

### Revocation

4. The Local Government (Boundaries) Order (Northern Ireland) 1992(a) is revoked.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order gives effect with modifications to the recommendations made under the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972 by the Local Government Boundaries Commissioner in relation to the boundaries and names of the districts into which Northern Ireland is to be divided for the purposes of local government and the number, boundaries and names of the wards into which each of those districts is to be divided.

The modifications to the Local Government Boundaries Commissioner's recommendations are outlined in the Statement of Reasons for the Modifications of the Recommendations of the Local Government Boundaries Commissioner prepared under section 50(9) of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1972.

The boundaries of the local government districts and their wards are as shown on the maps deposited with the Department of the Environment at Goodwood House, 44-58 May Street, Belfast, BTI 4NN (Articles 2 and 3).

Copies of these maps are deposited with the Chief Survey Officer of Land and Property Services, an executive Agency within the Department of Finance and Personnel, and a copy of the volume or volumes of maps relating to a local government district is deposited at the district council office. The copies are available for inspection at all reasonable times by any person.

This Order replaces the Local Government (Boundaries) Order (Northern Ireland) 1992 which is revoked by Article 4.

## STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MODIFICATIONS OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOUNDARIES COMMISSIONER.

### DRAFT LOCAL GOVERNMENT (BOUNDARIES) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 2012

- This Statement of Reasons for Modifications of the Recommendations of the Local
  Government Boundaries Commissioner has been prepared by the Department of the
  Environment to accompany the Statutory Rule (details above) which is laid before the
  Northern Ireland Assembly.
- The Local Government Boundaries Commissioner's Final Recommendations are modified as given below.


### Galwally

- 3. The district boundary recommended by the Commissioner would result in the Civic and Administrative headquarter offices of Castlereagh Borough Council being in the new Belfast district. To ensure continuity of service provision, it is vital that the headquarter offices are retained in the new Lisburn and Castlereagh district. Relocation of the services delivered from these offices would be costly. Castlereagh Borough Council has already invested significant funds in building the Galwally premises. To force relocation at further cost to ratepayers is not justifiable. In addition, it makes economic and logistical sense to retain these offices as an administrative centre for the eastern part of the new district.
- 4. The district boundary recommended by the Commissioner shall be modified to follow the Outer Ring Road (A55) along the perimeter of Belvoir Estate to the Saintfield Road junction, the Saintfield Road towards Belfast and then the perimeter of the commercial development at Forestside through to the Outer Ring Road (A55). The boundary follows the Outer Ring Road (A55) towards Lisburn until it joins with the Glencregagh Road. It then follows the Glencregagh Road until it converges with the boundary as recommended by the Commissioner.

### Ballyhanwood

- 5. The boundary recommended by the Commissioner would result in the area including the entertainment complex at Ballyhanwood, the Dundonald Ice Bowl and the David Lloyd Centre being in the Lisburn and Castlereagh district. An area of undeveloped land which lies between the David Lloyd Centre and the Vionville Rise housing development within the Tullycarnett estate, which is earmarked for development linked directly to the ongoing commercial development of the immediate area, would be, however, in the new Belfast district. It makes economic and commercial sense to ensure that all the land linked to the ongoing development site is retained in one district rather than split between two districts.
- 6. The boundary, as recommended by the Commissioner, will run between the Hanwood Business Park and the area including the entertainment complex at Ballyhanwood, at which point it shall be modified to head westwards 54 metres along the Old Dundonald Road towards a track to the south of Tullycarnet Presbyterian Church, where it will follow the entire length of the western side of the track. The boundary will then follow the field boundary in a south easterly direction to converge with the ward boundary recommended by the Commissioner.
- The Hanwood Business Park will remain within the new Belfast as recommended by the Commissioner.

## MODIFIED WARD BOUNDARY - GALWALLY



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
Ward boundaries as per Lucal Government Boundaries Commissioner's Fluis Recommendations
