1	Relevant Background Information
1.1	Wilmont House lies within Sir Thomas and Lady Dixon Park and is currently vacant and unused by the Council. Wilmont House is a Listed Building and preserving the structure from the effects of wind and rain continues to be a draw on Council resources.
1.2	Following responses to an Expressions of Interest advertisement, the Parks and Leisure Committee, at its meeting on 14 June 2012, received a report on potential future uses of the building and preparation of a Development Brief for further public advertisement.
