

Summary of Issues

The application seeks full permission for the erection of a 3.0m high bronze sculpture of John 'Rinty' Monaghan in Cathedral Gardens, within the Cathedral Conservation Area. The main issue to be considered in this case is:

Impact of the proposal upon the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.

The proposal has been assessed against relevant planning policies including BMAP, PPS1 and PPS6. The proposal is considered as an enhancement of the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.

Transport NI has no objections.

Characteristics of the Site and Area

- 1.0 The application is located within the Cathedral Conservation Area. The site is bordered by York Road, Academy Street and Donegall Street. It is a public open space with pre-existing artwork and stone paved and grass areas. The site has a mostly flat topology apart from a small raised platform for the grass area. There is seating present, which surrounds the raised tree boxes at the York Street side. The site is enclosed with a low concrete wall measuring 1ft in height.
- 2.0 The neighbouring buildings are primarily in non-residential use such as office, commercial, education and for religious purposes. It is in close proximity to St Anne's Cathedral and the University of Ulster Campus.

- 9.1 The key issue to consider is the effect upon the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.
- 9.2 The scale, design and materials of the proposal are sympathetic and will not detract from the appearance and character of the surrounding area.

- 9.3 This proposal has been assessed against PPS1, the sculpture is considered to be of high quality and design which will help to improve the quality of the existing environment.
- 9.4 In relation to PPS6 Policy BH 12, the Council will allow proposals in Conservation Areas that enhance the character and appearance of the area and that are sympathetic with the characteristic built form of the area. The scale, form, materials and detailing of the development should also be respectful of the characteristics of other buildings present in the area.
- 9.5 The proposed sculpture does not have a negative effect on the appearance of the immediate neighboured. It is well designed, sensitively sited and contributes positively to the area. The scale and size is in keeping with the area. The sculpture gives a sense of quality, permanence and celebration of a local athlete's success and will enhance the character and appearance of the Conservation Area.
- 9.6 The conservation officer was consulted on the submitted details and confirmed that the proposal would not adversely impact on the Cathedral Conservation Area. It therefore complies with PPS6's requirements in this regard.
- 9.7 Transport NI were consulted and offered no objection.
- 9.8 Neighbouring residents have been consulted as part of the Neighbour Notification Scheme. No objections have been received from third parties.
- 9.9 The proposal complies with the Area Plan and relevant policies. Approval of permission is recommended.
