Purpose of Report or Summary of main Issues
In June the report on the proposed plan development programme outlined the
requirements for the development of the Local Development Plan (LDP).
In taking forward the LDP Council will need to engage consultancy support to provide
independent expert advice to assist informing the appropriate level of growth to be set out
in the Plan. This will inform the development of the plan Option, Strategy and Local
Policies incorporates an assessment of the social and economic drivers.
Recommendations
Members are asked to consider this report and agree to the commissioning of consultancy
support, up to the value of £30,000, engage consultancy support to provide independent
expert advice to assist informing the appropriate level of growth to be set out in the Plan.
Main Report
The Council is preparing the new Local Development Plan (LDP) for Belfast. The plan will
set out development proposals for the period to 2030. A major challenge will be
establishing the appropriate level of potential population growth for the city over the life of
the plan.

- 3.2 The proposed work will provide guidance to the Council on the appropriate levels of growth that will be used to inform the LDP Strategic Options and Core Strategy consultation.
- 3.3 The LDP process requires Local Authorities to prepare Strategic Options and consult on the formal Core Strategy for the Plan. This process involves gaining feedback on different levels of growth that must be realistic and sustainable. Preliminary work has been undertaken by the Council on past levels of growth and NISRA have published population growth projections based on past trends (see Appendix 1).
- 3.4 The current scenarios based on the NISRA data suggest limited growth in the city over the proposed plan period and a falling share of the overall Northern Ireland population:
 - 2022 Population Estimate of 344,700 this equates to modest population growth of 10,800 or 3.2% over the period 2012 -2022.
 - 2037 Population Estimate of 346,700 this suggest the growth will fall over the longer term and equates to an increase of 12,700 or 3.9% for the period 2012-37.
- 3.5 A critique of these proposed options together with recommended options on levels of growth to be used in the formal consultation process is required. The work must include a logical explanation of projections clearly referencing their justification for its inclusion as an option.
- The work will also provide a detailed analysis on the merits or otherwise of the different levels of potential growth options to inform the consultation process. This work will be required in stages for the Options paper and the Core Strategy.
- 3.7 The analysis will be based on a rage of factors for each of the options to ensure they are robust and can be included within the LDP taking account of the need to meet the test for soundness and the provisions set out for the plan production. This will include:
 - The analysis of migration rates assumed to apply during the plan period;
 - Clear articulation of how options respond to evidence of social and economic needs;
 - The deliverability in terms of market conditions including past building rates, potential future rates and the provision of necessary infrastructure;
 - The assessment of factors relating to land supply, constraints and sustainability;
