1.0	Purpose of Report/Summary of main Issues
1.1	To consider an application from Mr. Victor Wilkinson for the renewal of a Stationary Street Trading Licence for the designated site in Cornmarket, outside BHS.
1.2	The Committee is reminded that, due to a number licence infringements committed by Mr Wilkinson at the site, you originally considered a renewal application at your meeting on 18 th February 2015. After considering the application at that time, you were minded to refuse the application on the discretionary grounds that he was, on account of misconduct or some other reason relating to trading activities, unsuitable to hold a Street Trading Licence and you agreed that Mr. Wilkinson be invited to a future meeting at which he could make representations in relation to the proposed refusal of his renewal application.
1.3	The application was reconsidered at a further meeting on 17 th June 2015, at which you agreed to rescind your decision of 18 th February and, accordingly, granted the Street Trading Licence to Mr Wilkinson for a period of 6 months. The purpose of the shorter period was also to allow for the licence to be monitored to ensure that there were no further breaches of the licence. A copy of the minutes from that meeting is attached.

2.0	Recommendations
2.1	Taking into account the information presented and any representations received you are required to make a decision to either: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Grant and approve the licence, or2. Grant and approve the licence with additional conditions, or3. Refuse the application.

2.2	Should you be of a mind to refuse the application you are required to advise the applicant of your intention to do so.
2.3	If, subsequent to hearing the applicant, you refuse the application the applicant may appeal that decision to the County Court.

3.1	<p><u>Key Issues</u></p> <p>Mr Wilkinson sells shirts, scarves, badges, hats, flags, pictures and mugs, all of a soccer and George Best theme. He also wishes to sell batteries, lighters, wrapping paper, greeting cards, umbrellas, toys, tour tickets, boxer shorts, socks, gift bags, St Patrick's Day and Pride Day hats, flags, whistles and necklaces.</p> <p>He proposes to use his current trailer measuring 3 metres by 1.5 metres.</p> <p>His proposed hours of operation are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monday to Sunday 1100 hrs to 1800 hrs <p>Mr Wilkinson has been inspected during the past 6 months and he has not committed any further licence infringements.</p> <p><u>Financial and Resource Implications</u></p> <p>If the Committee grants a Street Trading Licence, the fee is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An application Fee of £100, and • A Licence fee, for Monday to Sunday, of £1017 per annum. <p><u>Equality or Good Relations Implications</u></p> <p>There are no equality or good relations issues.</p>
