1.0	Purpose of Report or Summary of main issues
1.1	The purpose of this report is to update Members on plans for the upcoming Sister
	Cities Summit, and encourage participation in the Belfast programme by Members.
2.0	Recommendations
2.1	Members will recall their decision of 12 August 2015 to host a Sister Cities delegation from Boston and Nashville in Belfast from 19-21 April 2016, and their approval on 10 February 2016 of Council's participation in the Sister Cities International Summit in Dublin on 21-22 April 2016.
2.2	 The Committee is asked to: consider participation in relevant elements of the Belfast programme (19-21 April) and attend the drinks reception and welcome dinner in City Hall on 20 April 2016.

3.0	Main report
	Key Issues
3.1	International Sister City Event, April 2016
	Belfast City Council, along with 62 other Irish and Northern Irish local authorities
	who have US-based sister city and partnership linkages, have been invited by the
	cities of Dublin and San Jose to participate in an International Summit to take place
	in Dublin in April 2016. This event will celebrate Northern Ireland/Ireland – US
	connections, including the role that these relationships have played in supporting
	sustainable economic growth on the island of Ireland.
3.2	The Dublin event will take place over two days, from 21-22 April 2016. In addition,
	Sister Cities in Northern Ireland and Ireland will host their partner cities either before
	or after these dates. In the case of Belfast, both Nashville and Boston have
	confirmed delegations and will participate in a two day Belfast programme of
	meetings and visits from 19-21 April. A copy of the draft programme is attached for
	Members' consideration. The logistics for the Belfast visit are now advanced. In
	order to underline the importance that Belfast City Council attaches to these links
	and to build further connections with key contacts, Members are encouraged to take
	part in the programme, and are asked to contact Laura Leonard in the EU and
	International Relations Unit with regard to this.
3.3	Members of the City Growth and Regeneration Committee have already been
	invited to attend the welcome reception and dinner on 20 April and cross-party
	representation at the Dublin Summit has now been confirmed.
3.4	Financial & Resource Implications
	At the 12 August 2015 City Growth and Regeneration Committee meeting, £10,000
	was approved to cover the costs associated with the event and coming from existing
	budgets
