| BF-002 | Upper Springfield Resource Centre | Springhill Springmadden Street Garden | £3,000 | £1,000 | The project will deliver a series of workshops. The theme will be around hope, light and positivity, creating garden/flower planting which will symbolise all things positive to the families bereaved through suicide, residents and local young people. |
| BF-010 | Belfast South Community Resources | Flowering Sandy Row | £3,750 | £500 | Project will purchase the materials to make up 60 hanging baskets. These will then be hung from the lamp posts along the length of Sandy Row. Working with the women's group and the charter youth club BSCR will purchase the materials to make up the baskets, and organise classes where the youth club and the women's group will work together to plant (make up colourful displays) out the baskets. |
| BF-013 | Colin Glen Youth | Green Gateway Project | £5,000 | £4,000 | The project will design and develop the entrance way to the forest park by planting new trees, clearing old pathways, laying new soil and planting, and providing rubbish bins. |
| BF-020 | Newhill Youth & Community Association | Newhill Nurturing the Environment | £4,270 | £4,000 | The project will plant native flowers and trees around the community centre and nursery, plus design and produce containers. |
| BF-022 | Charter NI | Civic Diamonds | £3,460 | £2,500 | The project will see the general clean-up of alleys, entries and walkways across 20 streets in the area, including removal of weeds, graffiti and fly-tipping. This will increase the pride and ownership within the community. |
| BF-027 | Ashfield Boys Parent group | Ashfield Boys Parent group | £5,000 | £2,000 | The project will develop a piece of unused land on the school grounds into a community and school garden with allocation of allotments. It will help the students and parents to grow and develop the garden further. |
| BF-032 | Artillery Youth Centre | Artillery Youth Centre | £620 | £500 | The project will improve the appearance of the surrounding shops, businesses and walk way outside the youth centre by holding a clean-up, repainting railings, removing graffiti. This project will increase the feeling of safety for young people and the wider community. |
| BF-035 | Market Development Association | Market Resident's Environmental Improvement Scheme | £4,750 | £1,500 | In order to reduce dumping and anti-social behaviour in the area. The Environmental Improvement Scheme will involve clearing the site, painting the walls and installing decorative landscape features such as timber planters and flower beds. |

| BF-041 | Lagan Rivers Trust | Lagan Rivers Trust | £5,000 | £1,000 | Project will enable litter collection from the trees, bushes and bed of the river lagan by boat, in order to stop litter reaching the beaches of Belfast Lough. This will provide the opportunity for existing volunteers to be given new skills and experience. |
| BF-049 | Miracle Way | Miracle Way | £3,500 | £2,500 | This project will involve the cleaning, painting and planting of a shared alley behind Rutland St and Farnham St. The planting of the green space will take place in spring 2016. The community have shown a strong desire for this project. |
| BF-051 | Dreamscheme NI | Dreamscheme NI | £1,600 | £1,000 | This project will involve young people from Braniel in the landscaping and planting of native trees in the C7/Knock Road to Knock River pathway of the Connswater Community Greenway. The project will also involve young people promoting the new pathways to residents of Braniel and Clarawood estates through leaflet dropping and a community awareness event. |

| BF-001 | Garden of Reflection | Upper Springfield Resource Centre | £500 | This project aims to plant flowers in a Garden of Reflection and create a gardening group with families bereaved through suicide and local young people, who will maintain the garden over the longer term. |
| BF-003 | Bi Blathach | Bi Gaelach | CHOICE £1,000 | This project aims to increase the amount of pollinator friendly flowers in the area, by planting in local residents' and businesses' gardens. The project will support the group's overall aim to produce honey from West Belfast, whilst improving local gardens and building relationships amongst residents, businesses and school children. |
| BF-007 | Cross Generational Year Round Growing | St James Community Farm | £2,400 | The aim of the project is to create an environmental hub where local people are supported in growing veg and flowers which benefit the wider community and environment by placing window boxes, flower boxes and hanging baskets in the surrounding area. The cross generational aspect of the work aims to share skills and build relationships. |
| BF-008 | Ligoniel Park Fix Project | Ligoniel Improvement Association | £1,000 | The aim is to enable local and visiting volunteers become custodians of the local natural environment by making the local network of paths and green spaces safer and more secure. Practical maintenance work carried out regularly by two separate groups of volunteers will help people navigate the area much better. |

| BF-009 | The Larder Garden Project | Boring Wells | £3,000 | The aim of the project is to provide access to year round gardening activities for the local community where fresh fruit and vegetables are supplied to the food |
| BF-010 | Growing the Garden of Eatin | Donegall Pass Community Forum | CHOICE £1,400 | This project aims to introduce more volunteers to gardening through the existing community garden by providing gardening workshops including 'Grow You Own' aimed at encouraging people to eat more fruit and veg. Local people will develop skills to garden in an inner city environment. |
| BF-013 | Sailortown Regeneration Group | Sailortown Regeneration Group | £1,400 | The project aims to make a derelict site more attractive and environmentally friendly removing rubbish and hazards, painting the walls and planting flowers and climbers around the perimeter. The volunteers are made up of local people and ex-residents with an attachment to the area, and who will maintain area over longer term. |
| BF-015 | Patch to Paradise | Morten Team Ignite in partnership with Morton Community Centre and Helm Housing | CHOICE £500 | The aim of the project is to build a garden, creating beds and constructing a seat. Inside the garden the junior youth group will construct bins and recycling boxes to help alleviate litter on the street, particularly on match days at Windsor Park. |
| BF-017 | Footprints Women's Food Garden | Footprints Women's Centre | CHOICE £2,000 | The aim of this project is to transform neglected spaces into food producing gardens. Women and children will develop transferable food growing skills to their own homes. The group will plant fruit trees and shrubs to supply fresh fruit, homemade jams and chutneys to the local community. |
| BF-018 | Divis Inclusion Raised Bed Project | St Marys Primary School | £2,200 | The aim of the project is for a number of local groups to come together to build a series of raised beds and fill with plants, which is portable and can move around the local area and provide a focus for inclusion and integration. The garden will reflect the range of traditions and cultures that now make up the local community. |

Total LHLH main grant amount awarded was £10,500. There is an additional £10,000 allocated to Belfast area projects to be awarded during a second round of funding (Dec 2016).

Within the Belfast City Council Area, Choice Housing also awarded £4,900 to 4 projects.
