1.0	Purpose of Re	port/Summary of Main Issues					
1.1	Members will recall that, at a recent meeting of the Committee, the Chairman raised the matter of the licensing legislation which the Council is responsible for and also how liquor licensing interacts with these Council's functions.						
1.2	The Chairman also proposed that it might be beneficial to develop some training around the legislation and the role of the Licensing Committee when determining applications under the legislation.						
1.3	Previously, Members have raised concerns regarding the decision-making processes of the Licensing Committee and the general powers, functions and legal issues the Committee is exposed to when executing their duties.						
1.4	The Chairman also requested Members to notify the Divisional Solicitor about any matters on which you would like to receive training which would assist in your role within the Committee.

3.0	Main Report		
	Key Issues		
3.1	As background information for Members, the Licensing Committee has delegated authority for determining the following matters noted below.		
3.2	Under the terms of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Order 1985, the Committee will, in relation to Entertainment Licences, consider:		
	 Applications for the grant of Outdoor Entertainments Licences; Applications for the grant, renewal, transfer or variation of licences where objections are received; Suspension and revocation of licences; Applications for a waiver to permit entertainment involving striptease or nudity. 		
3.3	Under the terms of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Order 1985, the Committee will, in relation to Sex Establishments, consider:		
	 Applications for the grant of licences; Applications for the renewal, transfer or variation of licences; Revocation of licences. 		
3.4	Under the terms of the Betting, Gaming, Lotteries and Amusements (Northern Ireland) Order 1985, the Committee will consider:		
	 Applications for the grant of Amusement and Pleasure Permits Applications for the renewal of Amusement Permits where adverse representations have been made; Registration of Societies in relation to the running of lotteries. 		
3.5	Under the terms of the Street Trading Act (Northern Ireland) 2001, the Committee witconsider:		
	 Applications for the grant of licences; Applications for the renewal, transfer or variation of licences where objections are received; Revocation of licences; Designation of streets or part thereof; Setting of licence fees 		
3.6	Under the terms of the Licensing of Pavement Cafés Act (NI) 2014, the Committee will consider:		
	 Applications for the grant, renewal or variation of licences where adverse representations are received; Compulsory variation of licences; Revocation of licences; Setting of licence fees; Suspension of licences except where in the public interest the Director, in consultation with the City Solicitor, considers that there are particular circumstances which make it necessary to suspend a licence immediately. 		

3.7	The Committee is responsible also for:		
	 the administration of the provisions of the Licensing (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 and the Registration of Clubs (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 relating to entertainments and liquor licensing in licensed premises and registered clubs, and; 		
	 such other licensing matters as the Director of Planning and Place considers appropriate to bring to the attention of the Licensing Committee. 		
3.8	Whilst the Committee has full delegated authority in relation to licensing decisions, there may be exceptional circumstances where it may reconsider any decision made which is referred back to it by the Director of Planning and Place, in consultation with the City Solicitor.		
3.9	The Licensing Committee is responsible also for the consideration of all policy and legislation in relation to licensing issues but in this case any recommendations made will be subject to approval by the Strategic Policy and Resources Committee and further ratification by full Council.		
3.10	Any training identified will be organised in collaboration with Legal Services.
