	11 soccer pitches that at the time will be out of season and resting.

3.1	Following the last 2 years of success, the IFA Ladies section has requested support by

3.10	Equality or Good Relations Implications  There are no equality or good relation implications with this report. The summer soccer programme is inclusive of all members of our communities.
3.9	Asset and Other Implications  The use of a grass area situated between resting grass soccer pitches. The grounds man will insure that no play occurs on seeded areas.
3.8	Human Resources There are no human resource implications expected with this report.
3.7	Financial & Resource Implications  There are no financial implications with this report. No additional costs are incurred with this request as the site will be open and staffed as a result of other sports bookings.
3.6	Council support with this programme will increase the number of young girls involved in soccer and small sided games.
3.5	The site already hosts a number of summer sports such as cricket, Gaelic games and soccer so the toilet and changing facilities will be available for use if required. As the site is already open, no additional costs will be incurred. It is difficult to estimate a loss of revenue as the use of a grass area does not currently exist in the pricing policy.
3.4	Each week a number of portable posts will be utilised to create small sided pitches and depending on the site maintenance programme and wear and tear the grounds man will allocate the most suitable area for that week.
3.3	The grass area at Mallusk plays host to 5 aside, 7 aside and 9 aside training and games.
	13 age groups. Last year over 630 girls participated in the small sided games development programme, an increase of 200 on the previous year. 16 clubs were represented during the programme with a total number of 32 teams competing across the 3 age groups.
