3.1	<u>Key Issues</u> The Council, at its meeting on 1st March, considered the following Notice of Motion which had been moved by Councillor Boyle and seconded by Councillor Mullan: <u>Review of Enforcement Services</u> “Belfast City Council is responsible for a range of different enforcement services, including such things as on-street drinking, management of litter and addressing noise. It is important that, when carrying out enforcement duties in

respect of these types of issues, our approach operates within the principles of consistency, proportionality and fairness, recognising the rights of all individuals.

This Council, therefore, agrees that it is timely for a review to be undertaken of enforcement activities across relevant Council Departments to ensure that such services are effective, efficient and responsive to the needs and demands across the City.”
