| 3.0 | Main Report |
| | Relevant Background Information |
| 3.1 | Research, recently undertaken, has apparently shown that the YCV flag currently in the City Hall collection was in fact itself raised at Whytschaete Ridge at the taking of a well-known German position known as 'Jump Point' during the battle. |
| 3.2 | On the 7 th June 1917 the YCV flag was carried by a number of young soldiers, including 19 year old 2 nd Lieutenant Brian Boyd who attended Belfast RBAI school. After he was fatally wounded the flag carrying was taken up 2 nd Lieutenant Sydney James Downey who came from Rugby Road and studied at Methodist College. He too was later killed and the flag carrying was taken up by another soldier who was also badly wounded before finally being raised at 'Jump Point' by Lieutenant John Dwyer O'Brien from Skibbereen in County Cork. This battle was particularly significant in that it involved the 16 th Irish Division fighting alongside the 36 th Ulster Division. During the battle William Redmond, a Nationalist MP at the time, was fatally wounded and carried from the battle-field by medics from the 36 th Ulster Division. The battle was subsequently won and has been remembered as marking a moment of reconciliation in Ireland's troubled past when, in the face of a common threat, religious and political differences were set aside. |
| 3.3 | Mr Ossieur has asked if the flag could be borrowed for a remembrance service at the exact spot (see Appendix 1) where the flag was flown 100 years ago. The service will be part of a walk following the route of the battle. It is held each year in recognition of the sacrifice made by both the 16 th and 36 th Divisions. This year will be the final year during which the walk will take place. |
| 3.4 | Key Issues The key issue is whether the Committee is minded to approve this request to loan the YCV flag to the Flanders Fields Museum in Ypres, Belgium. |
| 3.5 | The loan period will be for a maximum of 1 week and the flag will be returned in time to allow it to be on public display for the Somme Commemoration event in the City Hall on the 1st |
