	Key Issues		
3.1	The much anticipated Resourcing the Future Conference (RTF) returns this year on 27–28		
	June at One Great George Street. This year WRAP, the expert circular economy and		
	resource efficiency body which is collaborating with the Council on its Resourceful Belfast		
	Circular Economy Strategy, is joining CIWM, the Environmental Services Association and		
	the Resource Association to deliver this event.		
3.2	Bringing together waste and resource management sector professionals, opinion formers,		
	government ministers and policy experts, RTF 2017 will provide a forum for the sector to		
	come together to address today's major challenges and help shape the future landscape of		
	resource management.		
3.3	With a practical focus on day 1 and a strategic emphasis on day 2, delegates will have the		
	chance to input into future plans across the UK, learn how to tackle future challenges and		
	identify opportunities for change through a range of resources and knowledge sharing		
	activities.		
3.4	Delegates will leave equipped with the valuable insight and direction needed in order to		
	make 2017 a year for change.		
3.5	The RTF Conference provides a perfect platform to bring together colleagues from across		
	the waste and resource management sector and is particularly relevant to councils, waste		
	management companies, consultants, directors, academics, Members, producers, heads of		
	service and anybody involved in the supply chain.		
3.6	With ministerial keynotes and four key themes – "50% recycling & beyond", "Sharing		
0.0	cost & responsibility across the supply chain", "A UK vision for resource efficiency"		
	and "New delivery paradigms" – this year's programme is focused both on exploring		
	solutions to today's challenges on day one, and on shaping the future of UK waste and		
	resource management policy on day two.		
3.7	Throughout the conference highly interactive sessions will provide ample opportunity for		
0.7	debate, with day one's practitioner-focused breakout workshops specifically focusing on		
	areas of challenge or change. Topics include new contractual relationships, enforcement		
	and waste crime, future residual waste options and collection consistency.		
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3.8	The RTF Conference and Exhibition delivers a first-class conference and networking e		
	which provides insight and sharing of ideas that will empower those responsible for		
	delivering approaches to waste, resources management and the circular economy.		
3.9	The key topics are all very pertinent to where the Council finds itself at present with the		
	shift in focus towards the Circular Economy, the challenges inherent in the changing		
	economic paradigm for waste management and how to better achieve better quality from		
	wastes.
