Appendix 1: Ur City 2 Grant-Aid Programme 2016/17

1. Greater Shankill Partnership - £5,000

The Greater Shankill Partnership is the grant Lead Organisation. The grant will resource an education programme that will support the transition of P.7 children from primary to secondary school with a follow up personal development programme for participating children. The programme will be delivered in partnership with Belfast Boys Model and Belfast Model School for Girls and will target children in the BT13 area working to reduce anxiety and increase their readiness to learn. Workshops on numeracy and literacy are part of the programme.

2. Inner East NRP: £4,940

East Belfast Community Development Agency is the grant Lead Organisation. Through partnership working, they will deliver 7 developmental and outreach programmes to children and young people linked to health and well being, promoting learning, community safety, improving the environment, children's rights, the arts, community pride and contributing to the community. Accredited training for a young men's group is also part of the funding proposal.

3. Inner North NRP - £5,000

Ashton Community Trust has been identified by Inner North NRP as the grant Lead Organisation. They will deliver 9 area wide arts projects to children and young people linked to promoting young people's rights and to improving health and well-being. These arts projects will also help to increase creative skills and access to cultural activity, promoting learning, improving the image of the NRP area, the promotion of health and well being, and the promotion of social cohesion and good relations.

4. Lenadoon NRP - £5,000

Suffolk Community Forum is the grant Lead Organisation. Through partnership working they will deliver 5 area wide projects to children and young people including a cultural awareness interface projects, sexual awareness programme for young people with additional learning needs, music therapy for children with Down's Syndrome and personal development programmes for young people.

5. South West Belfast NRP - £4,964

Greater Village Regeneration Trust is the grant Lead Organisation. Through partnership working they will deliver over 8 community wide developmental projects to children and young people. These include health and well being programmes (fitness classes and healthy eating), a community Christmas event and a local history & cultural awareness projects for young people.

6. Ligoniel NRP - £4982

Ligoniel Improvement Association is the grant Lead Organisation. Building on the success of previous Ur City 2 projects, they will deliver a variety of Halloween and Christmas themed events to promote intergenerational practice, community engagement and participation and healthy lifestyles. The projects will also tackle the isolation that children and young people from the community often feel as a result of living in an area on the outskirts of Belfast.

7. Andersonstown NRP - £5,000

Upper Andersonstown Community Forum is the grant Lead Organisation. Through partnership working they will deliver a range of activities linked to promoting health and well being, and emotional resilience including boxing programme for boys and girls, a 'Cook It' programme in primary schools and a music programme.

8. Upper Springfield & Whiterock NRP - £5,000

Upper Springfield Resource Centre is the grant Lead Organisation. Building on success of previous CYP projects, they will deliver a variety of Summer, Halloween and Christmas themed events to promote intergenerational practice, community engagement and participation, healthy lifestyles, and building civic pride and to combat social deprivation and isolation.

9. Greater Falls NRP - £5,000

Blackie River Community Group is the grant Lead Organisation. The money will be used to fund a number of homework clubs and GCSE's revision class for children and young people in a community setting to develop responses to educational underachievement in the area that go beyond the school gates.

10. Inner South NRP - £5,000

LORAG is the grant Lead Organisation. Through partnership working the funding will help deliver 13 projects across the NRP area linked to health and well being, enjoying learning, good relations and personal development. These projects include soccer coaching, fitness programmes, after school's provision and personal development courses.

11. Crumlin Ardoyne NRP - £5,000

Ardoyne Youth Enterprises is the grant Lead Organisation. The money will be used to fund a cross community Valentine's Day themed event that young people will plan and deliver in partnership with each other. Young people will also be trained to film the event and edit and produce a film.

12. Ballysillan Upper Ardoyne Partnership - £5,000

Benview Community Centre is the grant Lead Organisation. The money will be used to fund 4 youth development programmes in the area linked to promoting self awareness, identity, reaching full potential, being healthy and skills and knowledge development. The money will also fund the

development of a 15 year youth strategy for the area that will help identify gaps in provision, services that work and services that do not, and to target new services. This strategy will be developed in partnership with young people from the community.

13. Colin Neighbourhood Partnership- £5,000

The Colin NRP is the grant lead organisation in the application. The money will be used to deliver to children and young people a variety of Christmas themed events that will help promote community cohesion, intergenerational practice, community engagement and participation, healthy lifestyles, and building civic pride.

14. Tullycarnet Neighbourhood Collective- £5,000

The Tullycarnet Neighbourhood Collective is the grant lead organisation. The money will be used to deliver to children and young people a variety of Halloween and Christmas themed events, a young people's summer scheme and development programme and a young people's community newsletter that will all help promote active citizenship, learning, achieving and contributing positively to the community.
