1.0	Purpose of Report or Summary of main Issues
1.1	The purpose of this report is to report to committee on the key issues discussed at the Strategic Cemeteries and Crematorium Working Group meetings held on 10 April 2017 and 3 rd May 2017.

2.1	 The Committee is asked to; Approve the minutes and the recommendations from the Strategic Cemeteries and Crematorium Working Group meetings held on 10 April 2017 and 3rd May 2017.

3.0	Main report
	Key Issues
3.1	The Strategic Cemeteries and Crematorium Working Group is a Working Group of the People and Communities Committee which consists of an elected member from each of the political parties.
3.2	The minutes from the Strategic Cemeteries and Crematorium Working Group are brought before the Committee for approval.
3.3	The key issues discussed at the 10 April meeting were:
3.4	Update on Permanent Memorial to mark Plot Z1 in the City Cemetery Members noted the update provided on the proposal to install a permanent memorial at Plot Z1, commonly known as the "Baby Public," in the City Cemetery, that it was anticipated that the completed memorial would be installed in the City Cemetery by late Summer of 2017 and that Members would be provided with regular updates on progress.
3.5	<u>Update on Memorial Management Policy</u> Following discussion Members agreed that officers would conduct exploratory discussions with sculptors around set prices associated with undertaking both the erection of memorials and associated remedial works where necessary.
3.6	The key issues discussed at the 3 rd May meeting were:
3.7	<u>Update on Memorial Management Policy</u> Members noted that a meeting has been arranged with Memorial sculptors for late May and that the concerns raised by the Working Group in respect of the costs to remedy unstable headstones would be highlighted.
3.8	Update on Economic Appraisal of future cremation facilities The Working Group noted the information which had been provided and agreed that, subject to the approval of the People and Communities Committee, members of this group or nominees from the People and Communities Committee, be authorised to attend a visit in connection with future crematorium provision in either the Republic of Ireland or the United Kingdom.

3.9	Update on Memorial for Plot Z1 - City Cemetery
	Members noted the update provided and that submissions have been received in respect
	of a procurement exercise to design and erect a memorial at the Z1 plot located in the City
	Cemetery, and that it was anticipated that the assessment process associated with the
	submissions would be completed by the end of the current week
3.10	Bereavement Administration
	The Working Group considered the information provided around bereavement administration
	and recommended to the People and Communities Committee that officers should pursue
	option 1 as a means to remedy the operational concerns which had been identified
	previously. Option 1 was that the cover required for the current opening hours is provided
	through temporary resources until the review of support services that is underway is
	completed and the new system and operational improvements are in place
3.11	Financial & Resource Implications
	There are no financial implications related to this report. The costs of the memorial at Plot
	Z1 will be met through the Council's capital programme. The costs of the study visit will be
	met within existing resources within City and Neighbourhood Services and Property and
	Projects revenue estimates.
3.12	Equality or Good Relations Implications
	There are currently no equality or good relation implications in relation to the capital
	projects however this will continue to be reviewed as the projects are developed.
