3.0	Main report				
	Key Issues				
3.1	On 6 th December 2016, The People and Communities Committee approved the donation of €1,000 towards the creation of a stone candle sculpture which would be gifted to Boston as a sister city of Belfast as part of a global initiative to highlight organ donation.				
3.2	The commemorative event will be held on the 30 th November 2017, and will involve the gifting of a commemorative candle sculpture by each of Irelands five major cities, Belfast, Dublin, Cork, Galway, Derry/Londonderry to the respective cities, Boston, Cape town, New Delhi, Melbourne and Barcelona.				
3.3	The timing coincides with the golden jubilee anniversary of the world's first heart transplant by Christiaan Barnard which took place in Cape town in 1967. The commemorative event provides an opportunity on a world stage to raise awareness and highlight a humanitarian cause that transcends all national boundaries. It provides an opportunity for a collective expression of appreciation and gratitude to organ donors and their families as well as a precedent for the possibility for future donation related gestures of global goodwill and outreach.				
3.4	The underlying aims for the commemorative event is for its message to be communicated to the widest possible international audience. The inter city/intercontinental civic pairing arrangements add stature and ceremonial impact and give the project a global context. The creation of media interest through the announcement of Organ Donation Transplant related initiatives could help foster a unified vision for this life-gifting cause into the future.				
3.5	The sculptures will be sited in centres of transplant excellence/education in each city which will add huge potency to the image and message of this global commemorative project.				
3.6	This gifting of the candle sculpture from Belfast to Boston presents a historic reference point since the first ever organ transplant was carried out at the Peter Brent Brigham Hospital in Boston in 1954.				
3.7	The attendance of the Chair of people and Communities committee or his nominee at the unveiling and launch in Boston will provide leadership and integration for organ donation. Belfast City Hospital is in the process of planning a ceremony to mark the occasion in Belfast
