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### *Who we are*

The Mental Health Rights Campaign is a network of people campaigning to improve mental health services. We have personal or family experience of mental health issues and suicide/self-harm and are supported by human rights organisation PPR (Participation and the Practice of Rights).



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### *What we know*

People who are close to someone who has died by suicide are an especially vulnerable group. Research shows they can be up to 3 times more likely to attempt to take their own lives. **We want to make improvements to the current referral system.**



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# What changes are we seeking?

The **S.A.F.E.R Campaign** (Support Automatically For Everyone Referred) offers simple changes which were identified by family members themselves. These are:

**1. An automatic referral for support** as families have told us that they aren't ready to decide about support in the immediate aftermath of a suicide. An automatic referral policy is already in place with Victim Support so a precedent exists. The change would take the present from 'opt in' system to an 'opt out' one.

**2. A new automatic referral system** for those who have family members admitted to hospital following a suicide attempt and later die there. Currently there is no pathway for support for these families.

**3. A long term goal of referral to the Coroner's Office for bereavement support** similar to a successful Australian model which provides sensitive, streamlined and effective responses.
