	Key Issues		
3.1	Members are reminded that, at your meeting on 20 September, the Committee agreed to attend training sessions which will be tailored to cater for Member's needs regarding licensing matters.		
3.2	The Committee agreed that the training should primarily focus upon the Licensing Committee Protocol and representation process, the legal principles governing the decision-making process and alcohol licensing matters and its relationship to entertainments licensing.		
3.3	Training topics identified will be organised in collaboration with Legal Services and Human Resources. Should Members have other queries or topics they wish to discuss these can also be covered during the sessions.		
3.4	Officers have identified dates in November and December to deliver two separate training sessions. Additionally, a date in January is available should this be more suitable. The dates are as follows:

3.5	Each of these training sessions will be held in the Lavery Room of the City Hall and will commence at 5.00 pm.

3.7	To assist with training delivery we have engaged the services of a Barrister who specialises in licensing matters and has been instructed in several Judicial Reviews on behalf of the Council including the ongoing challenge to the Council's Amusement Permit Policy.
