In accordance with the Council's policy for the erection of dual language street signs surveys
of all persons appearing on the Electoral Register for the above streets were carried out and
the following responses were received.
Conway Square, BT13
8 people (89%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate
1 person (11%) did not respond to the survey
Conway Place, BT13
16 people (73%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate
6 people (27%) did not respond to the survey
Devenish Court, BT13
19 people (86%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate
3 people (14%) did not respond to the survey
Conway Link, BT13
3 people (100%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate
David Street, BT13
4 (100%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate
The Council's policy on the erection of a second street nameplate requires that at least two
thirds (66.6%) of the people surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second
street sign in a language other than English.
Financial & Resource Implications
There is a cost of approximately £250 covering the cost of the manufacturing and erection of
the dual language street signs. The cost for these street signs has been allowed for in the
current budget.
