3.4	Publishing the statistics on the website makes the information readily accessible to everyone.  DAERA have informed the Council that the statistics for the period 1st April 2017 to 30 June 2017 was published on their website the 2nd October 2017. 3.3	Both the Department and Councils deal with a range of requests for dog-related information for example, correspondence cases, Assembly Questions, media requests and Freedom or Information requests. Making the dog statistical information available on-line will provide direct access to this information without first having to approach the Department and / or Councils. It is anticipated that this will have the effect of reducing the volume of dog related statistical requests made to the Department and Councils. You may also wish to consider putting your Council's dog related statistics onto its website.			
3.2	All Councils are required to provide quarterly statistics to DAERA on the range of enforcement activities undertaken by their respective Dog Warden Services. DAERA have a statutory duty to collate the statistics. The statistics are often requested by stakeholders the media and the public.
