1 1.1	Relevant Background Information This year will see unique pressures on Council resources as it copes with service convergence and the transfer of new functions as a result of Local Government Reform. This will place a high demand for ICT resources to cope with: Business as usual infrastructure services, ICT projects of strategic importance like the Superconnected Belfast, Continued delivery of external services particularly to the Housing Executive, Service convergence and Transferring functions Application configuration Data transfer Business intelligence License procurement CT equipment procurement and installation Telephony and networking services Server and storage capacity ICT Training Regional Service Convergence

2	Key Issues
2.1	The table below lists those ICT related Service Convergence costs (identified to date) which exceed £30,000 and therefore require committee approval. Procurement of these services are essential to either facilitate data transfer from IT systems in Lisburn and Castlereagh or to provide additional capacity to cope with the requirements of service convergence and transferring functions.
