3.5	The People and Communities committee plan includes a priority to 'develop and deliver an integrated children and young people framework and programme of work'.
3.4	In the Living Here ambition of the Belfast Agenda, council and our community planning partners, have outlined a number of priorities in relation to children and young people including:  • the design and delivery of a fully integrated approach to early intervention, early years support and family programmes, and  • supporting children and young people to fulfil their potential.
3.3	Since the meeting, officers have been meeting with officials from Youth Service on a more regularised basis, which is improving collaborative service provision.
3.2	At the meeting in April, elected Members outlined issues in relation to any reduction in youth service provision particularly the impact on marginalised and disadvantaged areas of the city. They also noted the ongoing challenges in respect of issues such as suicide, mental health and educational attainment and the need for improved communication between the Youth Service and Council.
