3.0 Main report

3.1 Key Issues

The power for the Council to consider applications to erect a second street nameplate in a language other than English is contained in Article 11 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) (NI) Order 1995.

Members are asked to consider the following applications to erect a second street nameplate showing the name of the street expressed in a language other than English. The second language is Irish.

In accordance with the Council's policy for the erection of dual language street signs surveys of all persons appearing on the Electoral Register for the above five streets were carried out and the following responses were received:

58 people (69%) are in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate 1 person (1%) is not in favour of the erection of a second street nameplate 5 people (6%) had no preference either way 20 people (24%) did not respond to the survey

	thirds (66.6%) of the people surveyed must be in favour of the proposal to erect a second street sign in a language other than English.

	of the dual language street signs. The cost for these street signs has been allowed for in the current budget.
