Update on Department for Communities' Access

3.0	Main report			
3.1	At the City Growth and Regeneration Committee meeting on 9th January, Members ag			
	to the Council acting as the management agent for DfC's Access and Inclusion Capital			
	Programme and supporting organisations to access the funding.			
3.2	The Access and Inclusion Capital Programme aims to increase accessibility at cultural			
	venues across Northern Ireland. DfC invited all local councils to act as a conduit for the			
	funding with an available regional budget of £750,000. The programme is designed to			
	support the capital costs (either works or purchase of items) of projects which will improve			
	accessibility to local cultural venues in the city. The maximum grant available to each project			
	was £30,000. Projects and spend are to be completed by 31st March, 2019.			
3.3	Eligible organisations across the Belfast City Council area were invited to submit applications			
	to the Council by 18th January, 2019. The applications were assessed by a panel of Council			
	officers who made recommendations to DfC for final approval. The Council received 22			
	applications, and eligible projects were ranked based on an agreed set of criteria, including			
	demonstration of need, state of readiness and ability to deliver within the timeframe.			
3.4	Additionally, officers worked alongside colleagues in Legal Services and Property			
	Projects, as well as the unit's Business Manager, to ensure compliance with the overall terms			
	and conditions of the Letter of Offer, in order to mitigate against any potential risks in the			
	oversight of the programme.			
3.5	A total of 16 applications have been awarded support under this programme, with a total			
	investment of £301,074. Details of these projects and the funding awards are listed below:			
	1. Accidental Theatre - £29,999 – Disabled lift repair and upgrade			
	2. Belfast City Council - £2,300 – Visitor exhibition hearing portable loop system			
	3. Belfast City Council - £17,100 – Chair lift at rear City Hall access door			
	4. Belfast Photo Festival - £27,081 – Disability Exhibition Facility			
	5. Black Box - £26,785 – Access and Inclusion Project			
	6. Crescent Arts Centre - £24,977 – Disability Access & Inclusion Project			
	7. Exchange Place Resources - £29,500 – Making Accessible Exchange Place			
	8. McCracken Cultural Society - £24,800 – Disability door access and toilet upgrade			
	9. Ormeau Table Tennis Club - £8,117 – Accessible table tennis facilities 10. Overidian Word on the Street - £6,000 - Disability accessible poetry jukehov			
	10. Quotidian Word on the Street - £6,000 – Disability accessible poetry jukebox			

11. Spectrum Centre - £24,864 – Spectrum Inclusion lift upgrade 12. Strand Arts Centre - £21,385 - Mobile Screening Project 13. Strand Arts Centre - £16,012 – Audio Visual Accessibility Programme 14. Theatre NI - £20,022 - Captioning Support Programme 15. University of Atypical - £11,220 - Access to Art project 16. Ulster Orchestra - £10,912 – Access and inclusion programme. **Financial and Resource Implications** 3.6 DfC has offered the Council up to £301,074 to support up to these 16 projects. The Council will contribute sufficient officer resources in order to provide effective oversight. There is no requirement for match-funding from the Council. DfC has indicated that the Programme may re-open for applications during 2019/20. **Equality and Good Relations Implications/Rural Needs Assessment** 3.7 The impact of this Programme will have positive implications for equality of accessibility to various cultural venues, touring products, and festivals across the city. No specific rural needs impact as this activity is all taking place in Belfast but the programme is available across NI.
