<b>1.0 Purpose of Report or Summary of main Issues</b>	At its meeting on the 20 <sup>th</sup> June, the Committee noted that it would, at its next meeting, receive a report on the outcome of a mapping exercise which had, following a Freedom of Information request, been published recently by the Brexit Select Committee, highlighting areas of joint co-operation on the island of Ireland which would be impacted by Brexit. The report also highlights the main findings of the mapping exercise for Members' consideration.
<b>2.0 Recommendations</b>	The Committee is asked to note the report.

<b>3.0</b>	<p><b>Main report</b></p> <p><u>Key issues</u></p> <p>On 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019, the Committee on Exiting the European Union published a UK Government document, on North-South cooperation, that had been prepared in September 2017. The scoping exercise, that informed the document, was undertaken by the UK Government, Northern Ireland Civil Service, European Commission and Government of Ireland. The scoping exercise focused on six areas: agriculture, environment, transport, health, tourism, and education. Each of these had sub-categories and so the full review covered a wide range of cooperation areas though it was recognised that not all areas would be captured.</p> <p>The purpose of the mapping exercise was to chart the range of formal and informal cooperation that existed with a view to maintaining North-South cooperation following the UK's withdrawal from the EU. As it was a scoping document there was no overall summary or conclusion. Instead, the document was intended to form the basis of discussion.</p> <p>However, the final document does provide significant detail and outlines 142 areas of cooperation. For each of these areas, information is provided as to the extent that they are underpinned by the Good Friday Agreement or existing EU legal and policy frameworks. Of the 142 areas, 54 were classified as directly linked, 42 as partially linked, and 46 as not linked. The report was written before development of the <a href="#">European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018</a>, which aims to retain most existing EU law in UK law after exit day by creating a new body of retained EU law.</p> <p>Officers have reviewed the 142 areas of collaboration and identified those that seem of most relevance to Council. 	<p>Officers will continue to monitor outputs from the Committee on Exiting the European Union in relation to cross-border collaborations affecting the Council. The results from the scoping exercise will also feed into Council’s ongoing Day 1 readiness work.</p>
